Sarah Evans - Executive Director of Dragon Boat Charleston

Promoting the physical and mental wellness among cancer survivors and their community through dragon boating

Sarah Evans became Executive Director of Dragon Boat Charleston (DBC) in February of 2023. Sarah's career background includes 23 years working in public education, 22 years as an adjunct professor in theatre, critical thinking and Appalachian Studies, 15 years as a management leadership consultant/trainer in manufacturing including Toyota North America, Nike, Subaru. Additionally, Sarah spent over 40 years in the arts producing, directing, managing, and performing. Sarah's relationship with South Carolina began during graduate school when a professor whose parents lived on Kiawah offered a rental home to recharge and rest after a particularly grueling performance semester. It was love at first sight. Sarah continued the love affair with the area and spent 25 years vacationing on Kiawah and Edisto Island along with her twin sons. Sarah made the decision that she would one day make her home in the low country of South Carolina. This dream was realized when she permanently moved to South Carolina from Lexington, Kentucky September of 2022 after retiring as an educational consultant/director for 26 school districts.

Not expecting to work full time again, she vowed she would only go back to full time work if it involved something she could be "passionate about". While Sarah was searching for part time work, she came across a very intriguing job ad on Indeed about the need for an Executive Director of a dragon boat organization in Charleston whose vision was redefining cancer survivorship. Being a cancer survivor herself, she was extremely interested in learning more about the organization. Once selected and becoming familiar with the organization it was clear that the mission of Dragon Boat Charleston was something that she could pour her energy into and continue the excellent work of the organization.

Sarah, knowing the healing power of DBC's mission activities, organizational goal is to be able to seek out and increase the number of new members so they can redefine what cancer survivorship means to themselves and their caring community. TRIBUTE TO SC FALLEN HERO

Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to *Army Captain Richard G. Cliff Jr.

Army Captain Richard G. Cliff Jr was a native of Mount Pleasant, S.C. and graduated from Wando High School in 1997. In his spare time Richie (as he was known to his friends) was an avid surfer with his favorite local spot being Folly Beach. He enjoyed days spent on his boat and wakeboarding with friends. He had an amazing sense of humor, always playing practical jokes on his friends. Richie had an infectious laugh and luckily for those around him, he laughed a lot. Richie made friends with ease, becoming friends with everyone he met. His friends describe him as loyal and kind, a born leader.

Captain Richard Cliff was commissioned in June, 2002, after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, N.C. At Appalachian State, Captain Richard Cliff was a member of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity and ROTC. After completing the Infantry Officer Basic Course at Ft. Benning, GA, he was assigned to Ft. Lewis, Washington, where he was a platoon leader with the 5th Battalion 20th Infantry Stryker Brigade Combat Team. He deployed with them to Iraq in 2003, and again in 2006, as a company Executive Officer. Captain Richard Cliff earned the coveted "Green Beret" in July, 2008. He was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 7th Special Forces Group, Fort Bragg, N.C.

* Captain Richard Cliff had returned home to be with his wife, Stacy, for the birth of their son, Richard Sanders Cliff, who was born on September 4, 2008. One week later he deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom as a member of the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force. Captain Richard Cliff was a Special Forces Operational Detachment, Alpha Team Commander. On September 29, 2008 in the vicinity of Yakhchal, Helmand Province, Afghanistan, *Army Captain Richard G. Cliff Jr died from wounds sustained when his vehicle encountered an improvised explosive device during mounted operations.

Captain Richard Cliff's fellow soldiers describe him as the perfect soldier. He never had a bad thing to say about anyone. He was driven to succeed and excelled at every endeavor. He was such a proud father and was the happiest he had ever been while holding his baby boy. Captain Richard Cliff lived life to the fullest, he loved with all his heart, and he had an amazing smile and that infectious laugh that his family and friends will never forget.

As an indication of our respect for Army Captain Richard G. Cliff Jr and others who gave their lives for our country, the club *places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

Army Captain Richard G. Cliff Jr, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf. Please stand as you are able and join me in reciting the pledge of allegiance.
