#### TRIBUTE TO SC FALLEN HERO

Good evening fellow club members and guests.

Tonight, we're paying tribute to \*Army Sergeant Shawn F. Hill.

Sergeant Shawn Hill graduated in 1990 from J. F. Byrnes High School in Duncan, South Carolina.

He was a defensive lineman on the football team, he ran track, and he wrestled. After High School, Shawn married his high school sweetheart Julie. They had three sons.

\*Sergeant Hill joined the National Guard in 1996 to provide for his family while he studied electrical engineering and continued to serve after becoming an electrician. Sergeant Hill was assigned to the 178th Engineer Battalion, 218th Infantry Brigade, South Carolina Army National Guard, Rock Hill, S.C.

In the spring, 2007, Sargent Hill deployed to Afghanistan for his second tour of duty. He returned home for Thanksgiving on a 15-day leave. Lillie Rice, his mother's cousin whom Hill called "Aunt Lillie," said Hill fried two turkeys, one for her and one for her sister. She hugged him, told him she loved him and to take care. Hill looked great, she said. "I was so glad to see him."

\*Soon after, Sergeant Hill returned to Afghanistan to complete his tour of duty. On Wednesday, Jan. 2, 2008, while serving Operation Enduring Freedom, Sergeant Shawn F. Hill was in Khowst province, Afghanistan when the vehicle he was riding in encountered an improvised explosive device. The blast was fatal. Sergeant Shawn F. Hill died for our freedom while serving our country. He was 37 years old.

Sergeant Hill's fellow soldiers remember him as a big man with a big heart; he was willing to drop whatever he was doing to help anyone. He was a leader on the battlefield and the other soldiers called him "Pit Bull" and "Superman". Working hard at everything he did was how Shawn is remembered. He was a good father, soldier and husband - he died doing what he loved.

As an indication of our respect for Sergeant Shawn F. Hill and others who gave their lives for our country, the club \*places US flags around our community several times a year. Each flag has a yellow ribbon attached with the name of a fallen hero.

Army Sergeant Shawn F. Hill, we salute you and your sacrifice on our behalf.

Please stand as you are able and join me in reciting the pledge of allegiance.
